GARDEN TIDBITS

It's been a great year for gardening! By August the lush new growth over the past few months needs tidying up. Spent perennials are being cut back. Evergreens are getting a trim and the long tendrils of vines like Wisteria and trumpet flower are kept in check.

This is also the time to pay extra attention to the rose garden. The stresses of summer are showing up with diminished flowering and diseased leaves. Now is the time to thin out spring growth in preparation for fall blossoms. We strip those damaged leaves and apply an environmentally friendly fungicide. It is important to supply extra water in the form of weekly deep soaks for all of the garden. Deep soaks make better use of our precious resource watering less often.

For the lawn, raise the mowing height to take the dry hot days better.

I have a few design changes planned for the fall in those areas of the garden that need it. The bed at the end of Merner Green and the old rose garden by the barn will be planted with the intention of providing more color to those areas. I am having the Buckeye trees along the creek trimmed. Lightening the load will help with bank stabilization.

Please enjoy the colors of summer. In bloom are vivid purples of Bougainville, the pinks and orange of trumpet vines and the cool blues of the Hydrangeas with splashes of red and bright yellow, orange and pink around the garden. Come visit the garden and ENJOY!

What a great way to kick off this summer!!!!







